



Ranking Guidelines

JUNIOR RANKING

1.1 The SRFI National Junior Ranking is the ranking given to juniors (Boys & Girls u19, u17, u15, u13 & u11) who participate in the following status / level of Championships that are held across the world:-

- A. SRFI National Circuit (NC)
 - One Star
 - Two Star
 - Three Star
 - Four Star
 - Five Star
 - Seven Star
- B. World Squash Federation Championship (WSF)
 - World Junior Individual (Seven Star)
- C. Asian Squash Federation Championships (ASF)
 - Silver (Two Star)
 - Gold (Three Star)
 - Platinum (Four Star)
 - Asian Junior Individual (Five Star)
- D. European Squash Federation (ESF) Championships.
 - Junior Open (JO) (Two Star)
 - Grand Prix (GP) (Three Star)
 - Super Series (SS) (Four Star)
 - British Junior (Five Star)

SENIOR RANKING

1.1.1 The SRFI National Circuit Ranking is the ranking given to senior categories (Men & Women) who participate in any of the following status / level of Championships that are held across the world:-

- A. SRFI National Circuit
 - One Star
 - Two Star
 - Three Star
 - Four Star
 - Five Star
 - Seven Star
- B. Professional Squash Association (PSA)



Ranking Guidelines

1.2 SUPERVISION OF RANKING:

- 1.2.1 The Championship Committee will publish the rankings in the first week of every month at www.indiasquash.com and will oversee the overall management of the Rankings.

1.3 POINTS CALCULATION FOR JUNIORS

- 1.3.1 All tournaments that are completed by the last day of the month will be considered for ranking for the next month.
- 1.3.2 Ranking points will be granted to Indian nationals. Foreigners who have resided in India for a period of more than 180 days may also be granted ranking points.
- 1.3.3 The top 64 players in every tournament will receive ranking points and will be included in the National Junior ranking list in the relevant age group.
- 1.3.4 A player's average point is calculated on a rolling 12-month basis. The ranking list is based on the total number of points accumulated (best four or less) by a player in these events in the previous 12 months, divided by 4. If a player has played more than 4 events in the previous 12 months, only the best 4 results will be divided to obtain the average.
- 1.3.5 When a player has played in two age categories and moves to the higher age category following a birthday, 50% of each of the best 4 results from the lower category will be transferred and the two records merged. Results from the higher age category will take precedence and will always be used to calculate the average, regardless of whether or not these results are the top four highest. Results from the lower age category will only be included in the calculation if the player has less than 4 results in the past 12 months, in the higher age category. To give a fair chance to all players who move over to the higher age category, their higher age category listing will be created in the month prior to their respective birthday. Their lower age category listing will remain in the ranking list until the end of the month in which their respective birthdays fall.

1.4 POINTS CALCULATION FOR SENIORS

- 1.4.1 All tournaments that are completed by the last day of the month will be considered for ranking for the next month.
- 1.4.2 Ranking points will be granted to Indian nationals. Foreigners who have resided in India for a period of more than 180 days may also be granted ranking points.
- 1.4.3 The top 64 players in every tournament will receive ranking points and will be included in the National ranking list in the relevant categories.
- 1.4.4 The SRFI Men's and Women's ranking is computed based on the players average calculated as a sum of the (PSA average x 5) and the average of the (2 best circuit tournament results).

1.5 WITHDRAWAL WITH PENALTY



Ranking Guidelines

1.5.1 Player will be awarded zero points and listed as a walkover (WO) in the rankings page for the following:-

1.5.1.1 Withdrawing after the closing date and not supported by a medical certificate or written justification before the start of the championship.

1.5.1.2 Failing to turn up for a Championship.

1.5.1.3 Withdrawing for the second time within a 12-month period.

1.5.1.4 WO will count as one of their 4 best (juniors) and 2 best (seniors) results for the rolling 12-month period and will be taken into account when dividing the points to obtain the ranking average. If a player commits one of these offences for a second time within a 12-month period, the player may be banned from the SRFI National Circuit for a maximum period of 12 months.

1.6 WITHDRAWAL WITHOUT PENALTY

1.6.1 One withdrawal after the closing of entries will be permitted per year (12 month rolling period) with a supporting medical certificate or a written justification (submitted before the start of the championship) which will be listed as a Withdrawal (WD) in the rankings page, without a zero point penalty. Withdrawal without penalty will be permitted only for players having no WD or WO against their names in the previous 12 month period.

1.6.2 However, a second or subsequent non-penalized withdrawal may be permitted at the discretion of the championship committee, provided that the player is withdrawing due to the same condition, with a supporting document. This may only be allowed if the entries for the second / subsequent tournament(s) had closed prior to the first withdrawal. All penalties will count as part of their 4 best (juniors) and 2 best (seniors) results for the rolling 12-month period and will be taken into account when dividing the points to obtain the ranking average.

1.6.3 A player who withdraws because of bereavement will not receive a zero score where the relationship to the bereaved is a spouse, parent, parent-in-law, step-parent, grandparent, sibling, step-sibling or child. Any other requests will be at the discretion of SRFI.

1.6.4 In the event player(s) registered for a tournament are unable to participate due to a natural disaster or cancellation / diversion of flights or trains, they are deemed to not have registered for the tournament, provided the committee is convinced that the players showed full intent to participate in the Championship and the situation was beyond their control.

1.7 WALKOVER PENALTIES



Ranking Guidelines

- 1.7.1.1 If a player fails to play out all scheduled matches they will receive zero ranking points for the tournament unless a medical certificate or written justification is emailed to office@indiasquash.com within two days of the completion of the Championship.
- 1.7.1.2 If zero points are awarded, the points will count as one of the player's 4 best (juniors) and 2 best (seniors) results for the rolling 12-month period and will be taken into account when dividing the points to obtain the ranking average. This penalty will be applied automatically.

1.9 POINTS FOR QUALIFICATION EVENT

- 1.9.1 If a qualification event is played, points will be awarded as follows:
- 1.9.1.1 17-24 position - similar to 17/32 position as indicated in the chart above.
- 1.9.1.2 25-40 position - 75% of points received by 17/32 position.
- 1.9.1.3 41-72 position - 50% of points received by 17/32 position.
